

LIMITED ENGLISH PROFICIENCY STUDENTS

Policy

It is the policy of the Essex North Supervisory Union to ensure that students whose primary or dominant language is not English, and who therefore have limited-English proficiency (LEP), have equitable access to school programs as required by law.

Implementation

The superintendent or his or her designee shall be responsible for developing and implementing procedures to comply with federal and state laws, which define standards for serving LEP students.
